Sam Brown and the Action Pistol Committee still have two shoots scheduled.

On Friday nights besides our normal fun shoot and get together, we will be starting a bullseye league. This will be 30 rounds with handguns, centerfire or rimfire.

There is a change to the 20th Oct. for the NRA Winchester Junior Rifle course 12 years and up. This will be Tuesday and Thursday for 3 weeks. When completed we will be shooting every Tuesday for regular qualification.
